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The Atkin Residency in the Art of Democracy supports undergraduate student artists to **investigate the paradoxes, evolutions, histories, stories, and possibilities of U.S. democracy.**

Open to creators of all kinds, this competitive yearlong residency provides a platform for artists to deepen their practice, gain visibility, and foster public discourse. Residents will be awarded a **\$10,000 stipend** to offset living costs, and support learning and the production of work.

WHY IS GEPHARDT ESTABLISHING ATKIN?

- Inspire conversation and action with concepts of democracy
- Success of past 'arts as civics' initiatives
- New vehicle for civic expression





WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

- Fulltime undergraduate students who will be enrolled for the entirety of the 2024-2025 academic year
- Students studying abroad in Spring 2024 are eligible, but those studying abroad Fall 2024 and/or Spring 2025 semesters are NOT eligible
- You do NOT need to have an artsrelated major or minor in order to apply



WHAT TYPES OF MEDIA ARE ELIGIBLE?



All types of artistic media are eligible! Including, but not limited to:

architecture, dance, drawing, digital media, fashion, film, music, painting, photography, poetry, printmaking, sculpture, theatre, writing, and culinary arts.



RESIDENCY EXPECTATIONS


- Create significant work(s) that investigate the paradoxes, evolutions, histories, stories, and possibilities of U.S. democracy
- Work 10-15 hours per week over the course of an academic year
- Work is a large-scale independent project that may build on past academic or cocurricular work but extends beyond current assignments

RESIDENCY EXPECTATIONS CONT.

- Select a mentor to provide regular guidance and critique
- Participate in weekly check-ins with mentor and monthly joint check-ins with mentor and Gephardt staff
- Plan and implement a public-facing event and/or other vehicles for public engagement
- Residents may opt to participate in a funded trip to visit the <u>Norman Rockwell</u> <u>Museum</u> in Stockbridge, MA

RESIDENCY EXPECTATIONS CONT.

 Per WashU guidelines, projects funded by this residency cannot explicitly support a particular political candidate or ballot initiative or be used in any way that could appear to suggest University endorsement or support for a political candidate, political party, or political action committee.

Portfolio

- PDF slide deck
- 3-5 slides (one artistic work per slide)
- Include a short descriptions of the work (80-100 words with title, media, dimensions, date completed, contextual info, and artistic intent)
- Include a web link to the work, if applicable (e.g. audio, writing samples, video). The content on the slides can vary based on media.

Portfolio

- For architecture, drawing, fashion, painting, photography, printmaking, sculpture, culinary arts: Pdf slides with 3-5 recent works, high quality images
- For dance, digital media, film, theatre: Pdf slides with 3-5 recent works, links with up to 15 minutes of video
- For music: Pdf slides with 3-5 recent works, links with up to 15 minutes of audio
- For writing: Pdf slides with 3-5 recent works, links with up to 10 pages of writing

Academic Recommender Form

- A WashU faculty or staff member who knows you in an academic capacity
- A form they fill out with specific questions

Mentor Letter of Support

- Can be non-WashU affiliated
- Preferably someone with expertise in the artistic media you would like to pursue
- Willing to provide guidance throughout the yearlong residency and complete weekly check ins
